

Government not to stop 'long march': Malik

RECORDER REPORT ISLAMABAD (January 07, 2013) : Interior Minister Rehman Malik has said that the government would not stop the long march of Dr Tahir-ul-Qadri. Talking to media along with Indian film actor Shatroghan Sinha and former member of Indian Parliament who called on Malik, Interior Minister said that the government had witnessed many "long and short marches". The Minister also clarified that the purpose of his meeting with Tahir-ul-Qadri was not to negotiate with him for restraining him from the 'Long March' but to inform him about the security concerns.
